The latest person to be beatified by the Catholic Church is Saturnina Rodriguez de Zavalia, more commonly known as Madre Catalina de Maria, who died in 1896 at the age of seventy-two. A lot of things about Catalina speak to me. First, she was given to emotional outbursts, especially during her thirteen-year marriage. After her husband died, she returned to her original vision of educating Argentina's girls... about writing and reading and about Jesus. One reason that dream had been put on hold was that all women religious in Argentina at that time lived in cloisters. Despite seven years of setbacks, she persevered and established the Handmaids of the Heart of Jesus, which continues to do her work in four countries today. Catalina inspires me in the way she didn't let her imperfections stop her from serving the Lord. I'll be blogging a bit more about her later this month.

Friends in Faith: Mary Lenaburg

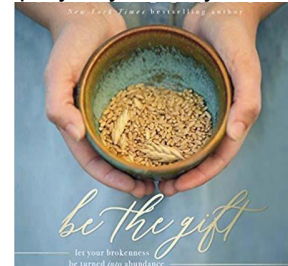

Mary reminds me, both in her words and in the way she lives, that God doesn't make mistakes... and has a special plan for each of us, flawed as we may think we are.
