Saint Aurea: About God and Second Chances

Between 850 and 859, forty-eight Christians in southern Spain were executed for their faith. The area had been under Muslim rule for about a hundred years; many Christians had fled or converted. Most of the martyrs were monks, and who among us doesn't have respect for a martyr? The one who speaks to me is


Aurea, is a widow in her 40s who had been living in a convent for some time. Initially, when her Muslim father's family reported Aurea, she renounced Christianity. Not long afterward, however, she regretted the decision. She bravely went to her death the second time the authorities came to investigate her.

Aurea's example reminds me that when we fail--and we all will-the Lord calls on us to pick ourselves up and, with His guidance, try again. I'll be writing a bit more about her later this month in my Wednesday's Woman feature (short profiles of beatified and canonized women).
