Next Saturday in Rome, Clelia Merloni (1861-1930) will be beatified. One would think she must have been tempted to feel abandoned--and sorry for herself--many times. Her mother died when she was just three. She suffered from a life-threatening illness. Clelia inherited a large fortune after having helped to create a community of women religious... only to have the fortune disappear due to another's financial mismanagement, which resulted in death threats against her. Internal strife followed, and she had to leave the community. Finally, two years before her death, she was allowed to return. Clelia inspires me because she kept slogging through all this, confident in the Lord's direction.
