In fact, she sent the authorities a vial of oil along with a letter saying she would be praying for them when they came to take the Christians away. Agnes told them: "You can kill us, but not the Church or God." I so admire her in-your-face faith and confidence in the Lord.

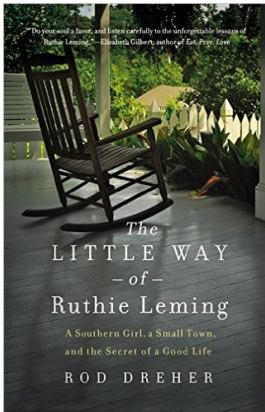
Friends in Faith
